Pastor's Corner:

Death – Not the Final Experience! (Ecclesiastes 3:1-3 & 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18, NLT)

"For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven. A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant and a time to harvest. A time to kill and a time to heal. A time to tear down and a time to build up."

"For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet call of God. First, the believers who have died will rise from their graves. Then, together with them, we who are still alive and remain on the earth will be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Then we will be with the Lord forever. So encourage each other with these words."

It is Memorial Day weekend and Memorial Day is a solemn day of remembrance by the families and a grateful nation. If there is any experience that brings home the reality of death, it is war. We know that as part of combat readiness, the men and women in the armed forces must continually go through training and some lives are even lost as part of routine training exercises. For the Gold Star families whose loved ones have made the ultimate sacrifice in the defense of the values of this nation, we express our heartfelt gratitude. Our nation is forever grateful for the service of your loved ones who served this nation under God with courage. We say THANK YOU. Their gallantry and bravery will always be remembered. We honor them today and always.

As a follower of Christ and Pastor, I know that death is a topic that most people like to avoid but avoiding discussions about death does not make it disappear or any less real. All we need to do is turn on our television or go online and read the stories of death, resulting from human wickedness, especially the horrors of war and the pervasive gun violence ravaging our nation. I am fairly certain that most people reading this have experienced the loss of a loved one and if you have not lost someone that is close to you, chances are that you know someone who has lost someone close to them and if you have not personally experienced the pain of death and bereavement, it is only a matter of time because it is a debt that we all owe.

All through Scripture, we read about death and the first mention is in the second chapter of the first Book of the Bible where we read these ominous words: "*The Lord God placed the man in the Garden of Eden to tend and watch over it. But the LORD God warned him: "You may freely eat the fruit of every tree in the garden – except the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. If you eat its fruit, you are sure to DIE."* (Genesis 2:15-16). As God warned, the disobedience of the first man and woman not only led to spiritual death but eventually physical death.

Jesus talked freely about His imminent death, and this saddened His disciples, but He tried to help them focus on the fact that His death was a blessing in disguise. In **John 14**, Jesus told the disciples and all of us that in the face of death, we can trust and hope. He says: "Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust also in me. There is more than enough room in my Father's home. If this were not so, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will always be with me where I am." (John 14:1-4)

What we believe about the teaching of Jesus and the entire Bible matters and will inform how we react or respond in the face of death or on a day like this. The assurance that death is not the final experience is what our brother Paul also writes about in our focus text from his letter to the early believers in Thessalonica. In the face of death, we can comfort one another with the assurance that Jesus will come back to make everything right.

How can we prepare ourselves and others for what is going to be a common experience? **Psalm 90:12** gives us a clue: *"Teach us to realize the brevity of life, so that we may grow in wisdom."* The wisdom that God gives helps us to use our time here on earth to please God because when we die, there will be judgment (see **Hebrews 9:27-28**).

It is Memorial Day Weekend and someday, all of us whose eyes are reading this will only be memories for others. Until then, let us continue to fight the good fight, to keep the faith and finish the race in Jesus Christ. **Pastor 'Debo**

Romans 8:12-17

New International Version

¹² Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

¹⁴ For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. ¹⁵ The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship.^[a] And by him we cry, "Abba,^[b] Father." ¹⁶ The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. ¹⁷ Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

John 3:1-17 New International Version Jesus Teaches Nicodemus

3 Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. ² He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him."

³ Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.^[a]"

⁴ "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"

⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. ⁶ Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit^[b] gives birth to spirit. ⁷ You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You^[C] must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."^[d]

⁹ "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.

¹⁰ "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? ¹¹ Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. ¹² I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man.^[e] ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up,^[f] ¹⁵ that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."^[g]

Scripture Reading: Genesis 2:4-17; Reflection Verses: Genesis 2:16-17

"And the Lord God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: From this passage, do you fully understand how death entered the human family?

Wednesday May 29

Scripture Reading: John 3:1-17; Reflection Verses: John 3:16-17

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: How can we have eternal life? Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

Thursday May 30

Scripture Reading: John 14:1-7, 19, 27; Reflection Verses: John 14:2-3

"My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: Are you looking forward to the place where Jesus has gone to prepare for His followers? How can you ensure you are ready to enjoy eternal life with Jesus and other believers?

Friday May 31

Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:35-58; Reflection Verses: 1 Corinthians 15:51-52

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: How can we escape the second death mentioned in this passage?
