Welcome to Rev. Dr. Steve McGuire: We extend a warm welcome to our Guest Preacher, Rev. Dr. Steve McGuire and his lovely wife, Rose. Dr. McGuire is from Athens County, Ohio. He graduated from Circleville Bible College (what is now Ohio Christian University - OCU) in 1978 and taught Bible and Theology courses there from 1983 to 2006. During that time he also pastored part-time at a UMC Church near Kingston, Ohio. From 2006 to 2022, he pastored full-time and worked as Assistant District Superintendent in the Foothills District of the West Ohio Conference. After retiring for 6 months, he returned to OCU, where he has recently been named Director of the School for Ministry. In this role, he is leading the drive to challenge a new generation of clergy to respond to God's call and undergo training to serve in local ministry, world missions, and evangelism. He is married to Rose, who is from Pickaway County and they have 3 adult children.

#### Pastor's Corner:

#### Chosen for a Purpose (Genesis 18:19, NRSV)

"No, for I have chosen him, that he may charge his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing righteousness and justice; so that the Lord may bring about for Abraham what he has promised him."

It is Father's Day. A day like this is usually a mixed bag for varied reasons. Regardless of what may be going on in our lives, it is important to honor and celebrate those for whom this day has been set aside. We should also pray for and acknowledge those for whom this is a difficult day for sundry reasons.

On a day like this, one of the many questions that may perhaps be on our minds (it is on mine) is what type of father or parent am I? What type of legacy or example am I setting for those around me, most especially for my three young sons? Sometime ago, I came across a quote that to me aptly summarizes what Legacy means: "What is left behind through the actions of a lifetime." What legacy are you leaving? When we read the creation account in Genesis, we see a clear purpose in the actions of God, the consummate leader. God is the Maker of ALL things created and He set a good example by teaching the man He created how to be the absolute best leader – a man after His own heart and a Champion. God created the man to rule and lead but also to serve. After creation, God handed over the management and responsibility for the upkeep of the Earth to humans and gave the man a leadership role.

The Lord God placed the humans He made in the Garden of Eden to tend and watch over it. We need to understand that RESPONSIBILITY IS SYNONYMOUS WITH ACCOUNTABILITY. God would not have given humans a job that was beyond their ability. God did not set us up to fail. God called Abraham out of a pagan culture and set him apart for a purpose. Just as God specifically chose the Israelites, the descendants of His friend Abraham to be set apart for Him in the Old Testament, God wants to use Christians, believers to model His standard and expectations for unbelievers.

In **John 15:16** Jesus makes the purpose for our selection clear: "You did not CHOOSE me, but I CHOSE you and APPOINTED you to go and bear fruit – fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name." The father is the one that God has given the primary responsibility to be the spiritual head in a Christian home but in our contemporary setting, some homes have absentee fathers for a lot of reasons, so mothers have been constrained to take lead in this area.

In his hymn, "I and My House will serve the Lord" based on **Joshua 24:15**, Charles Wesley the brother of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism shared with us how the head of a family, ideally the father who wants to fulfill their God given purpose to lead their family right can truly live out that commitment. From this hymn, I would like to suggest four helpful steps that can help us, especially fathers, to live faithfully into the purpose for which we have been Chosen by God and His Son Jesus Christ:

- 1. We must be obedient to His Word The first proof of our readiness to want to serve with purpose the one true God will be evidenced by our obedience to His Word. Our obedience to God's Word will be demonstrated through our actions and words. We will show by the things we do and those things we refuse to do that we know our heavenly Master and serve Him with hearts sincere. What do you believe about the Bible? Do you believe the whole Bible as the revealed, inspired word of God that contains all things necessary for sound living or do you believe that it only partly contains the word of God, and we can choose what to obey and when we feel like it? Secondly,
- 2. We must set a fair example for Others In the hymn, Wesley notes: "I must the fair example set, from those that on my pleasure wait. The stumbling block remove, their duty by my life explain. And still in ALL my works maintain the dignity of love." We are called to love others the same way that Christ loved us. We are called to have agape love for others. Love that is driven by our own love for God and not dependent on what the other person has done or whether they deserve to be loved or not. Fathers and Grandfathers (both biological and spiritual) must set a good example in this regard. What kind of example are you setting when it comes to loving others? Thirdly,
- 3. We must be a model follower of God: Wesley says in stanza three that to truly serve the Lord, "We must be easy to be entreated, mild, quickly appeased, and reconciled, a follower of my God." Jesus taught us about loving our enemies, praying for those who persecute us. He calls us to be like His Father who sends His sunlight on the evil and the good, who sends His rain on the just and the unjust alike (see Matthew 5:43-48). Are we model followers of Jesus of Nazareth? And lastly,
- 4. We must tell others about God's grace Wesley reminds us in his hymn that he was "A sinner saved from sin, who has his family to win, to preach their sins forgiven; children and wife, and through the paths of righteousness conduct them all to heaven." We are to demonstrate our discipleship by modeling our life after that of Jesus. Can people see Jesus in our conduct? Are we truly saved by grace through faith? As people chosen by God, let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us make a difference. Happy Father's Day!

"When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to him and said, "I am God Almighty; walk before me faithfully and be blameless. Then I will make my covenant between me and you and will greatly increase your numbers."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: Are you walking faithfully and blamelessly before God? Give examples of this.

#### **Tuesday June 18**

Scripture Reading: Genesis 18:1-19; Reflection Verse: Genesis 18:19

"For I have chosen him, so that he will direct his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing what is right and just, so that the Lord will bring about for Abraham what he has promised him."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: Do you believe God specifically chose you to be a father? How are you living into God's plan and purpose for your life as a father/parent?

#### Wednesday June 19

Scripture Reading: Exodus 19:1-8; Reflection Verse: Exodus 19:8

"The people all responded together, "We will do everything the Lord has said." So Moses brought their answer back to the Lord."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: With the Spirit's help, I will do everything commanded by the Lord in His Word.

#### Thursday June 20

Scripture Reading: John 15:1-17; Reflection Verse: John 15:16

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: How are you bearing lasting fruit for the Lord? How can you be even more fruitful?

#### Friday June 21

Scripture Reading: Ephesians 5:21-6:4; Reflection Verse: Ephesian 6:4

"Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: I will train and instruct my household in the ways of God.

#### **Saturday June 22**

Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 3:1-7; Reflection Verse: 1 Peter 3:7

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: How can husbands live into this scriptural mandate to be considerate as they live with their wives? What is the benefit of obeying this instruction?
