Pastor's Corner:

Do Not Neglect Corporate Worship (Hebrews 10:24-25, NIV)

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

If we think that the challenge of followers of Jesus Christ or Christians staying away from weekly worship gatherings and other forms of regular fellowship is a recent concern, we will be quite wrong. The writer of the letter to the Hebrews in our focus text took umbrage at those neglecting meeting together with other believers and reminded the recipients of the letter to intentionally make out time to gather with other faithful followers of Jesus Christ because it was essential to their growth in discipleship.

The Greek word "paroxusmos" translated as "SPUR" means to provoke or get into a fight with someone to make them do something they do not want to do or to get them to see things from our point of view. The word is only used in another place in the New Testament, and it was in respect of the "sharp disagreement" or "dispute" between Paul and Barnabas over their disagreement over John Mark (see Acts 15:36-39 for more insight). To be clear, Paul and Barnabas engaged in a raucous shouting match on the issue of John Mark.

The need for mutual accountability in our Christian walk is underscored in our focus text – as brothers and sisters in Christ, we must always explore ways to encourage one another toward love and good deeds because these acts (or lack thereof) impact our collective witness. We meet for corporate fellowship and mutual edification like the early disciples so that we can follow in their footsteps.

According to the writer of Acts of the Apostles, the first century disciples "devoted themselves to the apostolic teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer" and "Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts." (see Acts 2:42, 46) As they diligently came together, the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved (see Acts 2:47b).

I want to challenge anyone reading this to take corporate gatherings seriously because of its vital importance to our spiritual growth. We should not continue in the habit of neglecting corporate worship because it has inherent benefits for our spiritual growth. When we come together to worship and seek the face of the Lord, we find encouragement and strength as we pray for one another, share our joys and carry one another's burdens. Because the Day of Christ's return is fast approaching, we must not give up on regular worship with other believers.

Jesus had a remarkably busy ministry life but as we read from the gospels, He was frequently at the synagogues where Jews gathered for worship, teaching and encouragement because it "was his custom." (see Luke 4:16) If joining others for worship was customary for Jesus, we have no excuse to neglect or give up on corporate worship altogether. It is by regularly gathering with our imperfect brothers and sisters in the power of the Holy Spirit that we learn to better understand one another and love one another despite our imperfections. And this is part of our witness to unbelievers.

Whatever your excuse may have been for ignoring corporate worship in the past, I want to encourage you to form the habit of participating in weekly worship and other fellowship opportunities as we prepare to start a new month and the second half of the year 2024 this week. As a community of faith, we are going to be challenging and encouraging one another to take our discipleship to the next level to the glory of God and to our blessing. Jesus is always waiting to welcome us to worship. Let's not keep Him waiting.

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: Why do you think God is so mindful of human beings? How does the creation account in **Genesis 1:26-31** help you understand God's care for humanity?

Thursday July 4
