

2 You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. ² And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others. ³ Join with me in suffering, like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his commanding officer. ⁵ Similarly, anyone who competes as an athlete does not receive the victor's crown except by competing according to the rules. ⁶ The hardworking farmer should be the first to receive a share of the crops. ⁷ Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.

MESSAGE NOTES – Second Sunday after the Epiphany (1/19/2025)

Christian To The Core – Week # 3: Passion for the Harvest (2 Timothy 2:1-10 & John 4:27-38)

"Then [Jesus] said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Matthew 9:37-38)

CORE VALUE: God looks for men and women who share a passion for those without Christ. Jesus came to "seek and to save the lost." God desires that everyone be reached with the life-transforming power of the Gospel.

What then is PASSION? - Passion is a force burning within us, which seizes us; a power that moves us beyond ordinary human activity.

PASSION IS A FIRE (Jeremiah 20:9)
PASSION IS CONVICTION (Acts 4:18-20)
PASSION IS A CRUCIFIED LIFE Galatians 2:20)

Examples of Historical Figures that Had Godly Passion:

JOHN WESLEY (LEADER OF REVIVAL IN ENGLAND)
JOHN KNOX (LEADER OF REVIVAL IN SCOTLAND)
GEORGE WHITEFIELD (EIGHTEENTH-CENTURY BRITISH EVANGELIST)
WILLIAM BOOTH (FOUNDER OF THE SALVATION ARMY)
AMY CARMICHAEL (MISSIONARY TO INDIA)
SADHU SUNDAR SINGH (INDIAN EVANGELIST)
MOTHER TERESA (FOUNDER OF THE MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY)

PASSION AND THE HARVEST - Jesus almost two thousand years ago made it clear that THE FIELDS ARE RIPE FOR HARVEST. Jesus said: "Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." (John 4:35)

Jesus also said: "THE HARVEST IS PLENTIFUL, BUT THE WORKERS ARE FEW. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field." (Matthew 9:36-38)

WHAT IS THE HARVEST FIELD?

Approximately one-third of the world identifies as Christian. This broad figure includes all the different Christian denominations and groups. These people are saying, "Thank you, Jesus."

Another group comprising 28% of the world population are not Christians but have access to the Gospel. They live where they can hear, learn, and respond to the Gospel, but they are not yet following Christ. These people are saying, "No, thank you, Jesus."

That leaves 40% of the world's population with little or no access to the Gospel. In most cases, they have no Christian influence in their lives, no churches in their communities, and often no Bible in their languages. These people remain unreached by the Gospel and ask, "Who is Jesus?"

In the last century, the world population multiplied 3.7 times. During the same time, the percentage of Christians in North America has remained about the same. In Europe, Christians have not kept pace with the population change, growing only 1.5 times. However, in Asia, the number of followers of Jesus multiplied by 15, and in Africa, by 38.

The Church of Jesus Christ faces three formidable challenges in our generation:

CHALLENGE NUMBER 1: THE GOSPEL FOR EVERY PERSON
CHALLENGE NUMBER 2: A CHURCH FOR EVERY PEOPLE CHALLENGE
NUMBER 3: THE LEAST OF THESE (Matthew 25:35-40)

HOW CAN WE FULLY EXPERIENCE GOD'S PASSION FOR THE HARVEST - Passion is the direct result of our intimacy with God, our love for Christ, and our commitment to Him. Passion results in no longer living for ourselves, but living for God's glory (2 Corinthians 5:14-15,

PASSION COMES FROM GOD: Matthew 7:7-8, James 1:17

PASSION MUST BE NURTURED - The fire of passion comes only from God through PRAYER. The steps are clear:

.Commit to becoming a bondservant of Jesus Christ

.Ask...Seek...Knock

.Receive
