

New Year Message Series – Christian To The Core: We continue our "Christian To The Core" Message Series today with the Week # 8 Sermon entitled "Family Priority – God's Building Block for Society" We started the 12 Week Series on January 5, 2025 and it will take us through the Eight Core Values that have been identified after detailed research and prayerful discernment as foundational to living a life of faith and obedience to the Great Commission mandate of Jesus and His instruction to us to be witnesses recorded in Acts 1:8. The "Christian To The Core" Curriculum was developed by the International Leadership Institute (ILI) to equip leaders/disciples and promote the spread of the gospel. This aligns with the mission of the Global Methodist Church (GMC) to make disciples of Jesus and to spread scriptural holiness across the globe. Based on research over two years, they discerned that the best Christian leaders live by Eight Core Values that affect who they are and everything they do. The values are: Intimacy with God - Passion for the Harvest - Visionary Leadership - Culturally Relevant Evangelism - Multiplication of Leaders - Family Priority - Faithful Stewardship and Integrity.

The Message Series which will run through **Sunday March 23, 2025,** will help us better understand what it means to be Christian To The Core as we follow Jesus all the way. The Week # 8 Session in the Message Series today will help us understand how the Family is so important to God's plan by serving as the building block for society. The most important lessons we learn in life are learned through our families, and the most important lessons that we teach in life are to our children. Love the LORD Your God

MESSAGE NOTES – Seventh Sunday after the Epiphany (2/23/2025) Christian To The Core – Week # 8: Family Priority – God's Building Block for Society

(Deuteronomy 6:1-9 & Matthew 12:46-50)

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CORE VALUE: God looks for men and women who are convinced that the family is God's building block for society and who make their families a priority in developing leaders and disciples.

Family is the foundation for all cultures. It constitutes the root of every human society.

BIBLICAL FOUNDATION - God created family and the best way to understand the family is by examining the Bible.

The First Family - The Bible begins with a family (Genesis 1:28).

The Trinity and Family - God created humankind "in His own image" (Genesis 1:27).

Singleness - Singleness is a gift from God and was modelled by Jesus Christ.

Marriage – it is a model of the relationship between Christ and the Church. It is an exclusive holy covenant between one man and one woman.

God's Perspective on the Family Relationship - Every Christian needs to feel God's heartbeat for the family.

God's Foundation for the Family - God supplies us with three critical elements for the foundation of our homes.

The Word of God - God's Covenant - Intimate Relationship

As families, we participate in fellowship with the Lord and with His broader family, the Church.

Character Traits Related to the Family: Good Caregiver and Family Manager. The Christian leader and disciple must care for his or her family properly and provide good leadership in the home (1 Tim. 3:4,12).

Loving and Gentle: The leader must care for his or her family with love, respect, and self-control so the home is peaceful (1 Tim. 3:2–3).

Character Traits Related to Marital Life: Monogamous, Godly Spouse:

Character Traits Related to The Children: Leadership In The Home, Obedient Children

Six Characteristics of Strong Families:

Strong Commitment - Strong families believe in the value of the family and consider family a priority in their lives.

Spending Enjoyable Time Together - Strong families spend time together doing meaningful things.

Good Communication - Strong families communicate.

Appreciation and Affection for Each Other - Strong families express appreciation for each other; they are intentional about encouragement and support.

Ability to Solve Problems and React in Crisis - Strong families deal with conflict in healthy ways.

Shared Spiritual Life - Strong families have a shared spiritual life where, in the case of Christian families, the Bible, prayer, and worship are central.

Reflection Questions: Considering the characteristics of strong families above, answer the following questions:

Where is my family strongest?
Where do we need to improve the most?

Conclusion: Whether our family is a blessing, or our family is experiencing great dysfunction, we are called to love our family the way it is and prayerfully work in the power of the Holy Spirit to help our family become what God created and desires it to be.
