

MESSAGE NOTES – Transfiguration Sunday (3/2/2025) Christian To The Core – Week # 9: Faithful Stewardship – Effectively Managing Resources God Entrusts To You

(Exodus 36:2-7 & Matthew 25:14-30)

"His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" (Matthew 25:21, NIV]

CORE VALUE: God looks for men and women who are faithful stewards of finances, time, and spiritual gifts in their personal lives and leadership with the result that people are reached with the Gospel.

The biblical word that encompasses the dynamic way of living under the Lordship of Jesus Christ in the world is "Stewardship."

stands in contrast with this human notion—God is the owner of everything (see Psalm 89:8-9).

God's ownership is established by the following truths about God:

He created the world and everything in it. (Psalm 89:11)

He is powerful and exalted (Psalm 89:13)

He is in control of the entire universe and the very forces of nature (Psalm 89:9)

As Humans, we are MANAGERS (STEWARDS) of God's Resources. This includes our money, material properties, family, time, and even our own bodies.

From Matthew 25:14-30, we glean a profound truth - we are ACCOUNTABLE to God for what He has entrusted to us (Matthew 25:19)

Effective Stewardship Is A Learned Skill - We do not automatically know how to manage God's resources.

Financial Stewardship – The Bible teaches Three important Stewardship Principles that help us successfully manage the material resources God entrust to us:

The Principle of Faithful Tithing - The Scripture commands God's people to tithe, or return 10 percent of their income or the product of their work, to God for use in worship and service.

(Lev. 27:30 & Malachi 3:10-12)

The Principle of Sound Management - Tithing is the first step, but there is more to faithful stewardship.

The Principle of Generous Giving - Giving is as great a blessing to the giver as it is to the receiver. The Bible often affirms the blessing of giving (Luke 6:38)

Stewardship of Time: God gives each leader various gifts for ministry. Of everything God has given to us, time is perhaps the most perishable and wasted.

What Is Time? - It is the passing of life. Time is our most valuable resource. It is unique, because unlike other resources, time cannot be saved or recovered.

Time is the same for everyone. Time does not discriminate. Leaders and followers, organized or haphazard, lazy or hard-working, each have 24 hours a day.

We must be mindful of Time Robbers.

What Tobs Our Time? PROCRASTINATION. POOR PLANNING and SCHEDULING. LACK OF CLEAR PRIORITIES.

The Example of Jesus: The Bible teaches us to imitate Jesus.

Jesus knew that His time was limited.

Jesus never lost sight of His purpose.

Jesus understood that there is a right time to do the important things.

Time Management Has Significance:

Conclusion: We are accountable to God for the wise and effective use of both our material resources and the time we are given on this earth.
