

# MESSAGE NOTES – Second Sunday in Lent (3/16/2025) Christian To The Core – Week # 11: Integrity – Running The Race of Life and Finishing Well (2 Timothy 4:1-8 & Mark 12:13-17)

"Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mold, but let God re-mold your minds from within, so that you may prove in practice that the plan of God for you is good, meets all his demands and moves towards the goal of true maturity. " (Romans 12:2, J. B. Phillips New Testament)

CORE VALUE: God looks for men and women of integrity who live holy lives and who are accountable to God and to the Body of Christ. Integrity glorifies God, protects leaders from stumbling, and encourages growth.

Two basic elements enable us to finish well in "the race marked out for us." The **first** is to be a person of INTEGRITY, who is the same on the inside as on the outside.

The **second** is to live in active fellowship, receiving the encouragement and ACCOUNTABILITY that we need from others who are in the same race and share the same goal of finishing well.

BIBLICAL FOUNDATION - The Psalmist shows us that integrity has inward and outward aspects: "Who may ascend the mountain of the LORD? Who may stand in His holy place? The one who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not trust in an idol or swear by a false god. They will receive blessing from the LORD and vindication from God their Savior." (Psalm 24:3–5)

A person of integrity is the same in heart, mind, and actions, regardless of circumstances. Put in simple terms, integrity is being the same in heart, mind, and actions. We can think of integrity in three dimensions:

#### Integrity is WHAT I AM: WHOLE

God desires that we be whole or complete in Christ. Integrity means beliefs, attitudes, words, and actions that are consistent with God's nature. Jesus models integrity by living a whole and integrated life in which His inner life (intimate relationship with the Father) and outer life (the life the world saw) were consistent (Mark 12:14)

Integrity is WHAT I STAND ON: A COMMITMENT TO MY PROMISES
Integrity means we are faithful to the words we speak and the promises

we make: Jesus said: "All you need to say is simply 'Yes' or 'No;' anything beyond this comes from the evil one." (Matthew 5:37)

Integrity is WHAT I DO: ACTIONS CONSISTENT WITH MY PROMISES Our beliefs must be reflected in our words and actions. It is critical that our actions be consistent with God's command for integrity. There must be congruence between our words and our actions. (Matthew 7:21)

#### ACCOUNTABILITY: ENCOURAGEMENT TO LIVE A LIFE OF INTEGRITY

A personal commitment to integrity is a good start, but it is not enough. The secret to living a life of integrity is to live in active fellowship, receiving the encouragement and **accountability** that we need from others who are running the same race and share the same goal. There are four levels of accountability:

ACCOUNTABILITY TO GOD (Romans 14:12)

ACCOUNTABILITY TO OURSELVES (1 Timothy 4:16)

ACCOUNTABILITY TO AN INTIMATE FEW (Proverbs 27:17)

ACCOUNTABILITY TO THE COMMUNITY OF FAITH (1 Corinthians 12:27)

**Finishing Well:** While Jesus Christ is our perfect exemplar, we also have other biblical character - Apostle Paul is a great example:

Apostle Paul He STARTED RIGHT (Acts 9:20-22)

Apostle Paul FINISHED WELL (2 Timothy 4:7)

Apostle Paul Fought the Good Fight

Apostle Paul Completed the Race

Apostle Paul Kept the Faith and Finished Well

King Solomon is the example of a leader who did not finish well. King Solomon STARTED RIGHT. King Solomon FINISHED POORLY

#### HOW DO WE LOSE INTEGRITY? — ONE STEP AT A TIME

THE BIG FOUR - MONEY, SEX, POWER, AND PRIDE: These first four factors are the most obvious and common reasons so many Christian leaders do not finish well. They are described in 1 John 2:15–16: "Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them. For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world."
