#### Pastor's Corner:

#### The Open Secret to Fruitfulness (John 15:1-8)

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no FRUIT, while every branch that does bear FRUIT he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.

(John 15:1-2, NIV)

Today's focus text from John is one of the most intimate teachings of Jesus where He bears His heart (and by extension that of His Father) to the disciples and shares with them a fundamental truth about our purpose as disciples. In the first eight verses of the chapter, Jesus uses the word FRUIT six times. The Greek word "karpos" translated "fruit" is not really fruit like we understand fruit but a metaphor for the expected result of our efforts as disciples. In John's gospel, the word is used only seven times and the only other place where it is used Jesus makes it clear that the fruit He is talking about is not apples and oranges: "The harvesters are paid good wages, and the FRUIT they harvest is PEOPLE BROUGHT TO ETERNAL LIFE. What joy awaits both the planter and the harvester alike." (John 4:36)

Jesus frequently used farming or agricultural metaphor or imagery to convey profound truths about our mission as His followers - to make disciples of others. The purpose of a Vine is to bear fruit for its owner just as the purpose of disciples or followers of Jesus (in this case the branch) is to bear fruit - to bring others into the fold or kingdom. God is the Vinedresser or Gardener, and Jesus is the Vine. The Holy Spirit is the unseen SAP that flows through the Vine to the Branches to nourish them and make them fruitful. Branches that fail to fulfil their purpose – which is to bear fruit are not left on the Vine – they are ultimately cut off or taken away by the Vinedresser. **This tells us that unfruitfulness will not be condoned.** 

Just like any reasonable employer will not keep an unproductive staff member on their payroll, anyone who claims to follow Jesus and is not making disciples of others will eventually be removed. Unlike the unproductive branches that are cut off – a permanent action, the fruitful branches are pruned. The Greek word "kathairos" translated as "pruned" means "to cleanse of filth or impurity." The desire of the Vinedresser is for each branch on the Vine to produce the greatest harvest. The purpose of the pruning is to remove anything that may impede fruitfulness or growth – Jesus explains that this process of pruning, cleansing or purification is accomplished not be self-effort but by the WORD (Greek "logos") which has been spoken by Jesus. The WORD of God when obeyed makes us pure. The pruning results in variable results – harvest of thirty, sixty or even a hundred times as much of what has been planted (see Matthew 13:23 about the parable of the four soils).

How then do we accomplish our purpose as branches? Jesus again reveals the secret when He tells us: "Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear FRUIT by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear FRUIT unless you remain in me." (John 15:5-6) When we stay connected to the Vine by practicing regular spiritual practices of worship, prayer, communion, fellowship, service, and other means of grace, we are going to produce fruit. The benefit of abiding in the Vine is FRUITFULNESS, while failure to abide in the VINE results in FRUITLESSNESS. When we fail to abide in the Vine, we can do untold damage to ourselves and others around us.

I am positive that just like the Vine desires us to be fruitful, all of us as branches want to be fruitful but there is a process that leads to fruitfulness. That process is to intentionally abide in Jesus. Jesus also tells us that when we take the time to abide in Him – to have an intimate relationship with Him just as the branch has with the vine, we can ask for whatever we wish, and it will be done for us. However, we need to be careful not to misunderstand this to mean that we can ask for things that do not align with the will of the Father. If our request aligns with the will of the Father and will advance our purpose which is to bear fruit, we can be sure that God will grant the request in His own perfect timing.

We have no other work but to make disciples of Jesus. But to make disciples of Jesus, we must first become devoted disciples of Jesus because we cannot help others to become what we have not taken the time to become. What are the results of your abiding in the Vine? Are you an unproductive branch that is taking valuable space on the Vine? Heed the warning of Jesus and become fruitful so you will not be cut off. And if you are a branch that is producing minimal fruit and is undergoing pruning, endure the ongoing pain of pruning so that you can maximize your potential – become even more fruitful.

So, take intentional time to be holy today and everyday by regularly praying to the Lord. Make abiding in Jesus your only desire by feeding on His living Word. Stay connected with other branches that share a common purpose and desire with you – to be fruitful, and if you see other branches that are weak or not maximizing their potential because of distractions, help and support them by speaking the truth in love. Above all, in all that you do, never forget to seek the blessing of the Lord. When we all have done all this, we will bring glory and honor to God and thereby prove our discipleship.

# Philip and the Ethiopian

For his life was taken from the earth."[b]

<sup>34</sup> The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" <sup>35</sup> Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus.




