

Sixth Avenue GMC - Called Church Conference: This serves to inform all members and friends of Sixth Avenue GMC that the Administrative Council has requested that our Presiding Elder, Rev. John Alice call a Church Conference for Sunday, May 19, 2024. Please recall that at our Charge Conference held on Sunday October 22, 2023, members voted based on the recommendation of the Board of Trustees and the Administrative Council for the sale of the Church Parsonage at 951 Pratt Avenue, Lancaster, OH 43130. This meeting has been called for the express purpose of presenting a motion before members for our Finance Team to utilize part of the proceeds from the sale of the Parsonage to meet urgent recurrent expenses to ensure that we can continue to stay on mission. All professing members are eligible to attend and vote at the meeting. Under the Transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline of the GMC, it is provided as follows: "No real property on which a church building or parsonage is located shall be mortgaged or sold to provide for the current budget or operating expense of a local church without the approval of sixty percent of the members and the full awareness of and consultation with the presiding elder (district superintendent). We are in consultation with our Presiding Elder and look forward to having members vote to ratify the recommendation of the Administrative Council. Please be on the lookout for more information on this important meeting where other pressing matters related to next steps for our community of faith will be discussed. Pastor's Corner:

What Goes Up Must Come Down

"And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." (John 14:3, NIV)

"After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." (Acts 1:9-11, NIV)

The gathered disciples of Jesus witnessed a disappearing act almost two thousand years ago and the Church now celebrates this historic moment as Ascension Day. The Day is traditionally celebrated forty days after Easter (Resurrection Day), and it fell on Thursday May 9, 2024. The Sunday immediately after is celebrated as Ascension Sunday and the gathered faithful commemorate the return of Jesus to heaven in corporate worship.

Jesus took time to prepare His disciples for this time of transition but told them it was not going to be a permanent separation. Some of us reading this may have come across the phrase, "What goes up must come down." This phrase simply means that things that go up are expected to come down eventually because of gravity. Humans have been able to perform incredible feats in the field of space exploration and we have "conquered" the Moon since the first human landing in 1969. The distance that manned space shuttles or unmanned rockets travel is mind boggling and we know that things sometimes go awry when accidents happen either during the ascent or descent of the shuttles or rockets.

We also see many accounts in Scripture of angels coming down from heaven as special messengers from God. God Himself came down in the flesh in the person of Jesus Christ to become one of us for a season. After completing His mission here on Earth, Jesus in the full view of His gathered disciples ascended to heaven where Scripture tells us He is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty until He will return one day to judge the world. In the case of Jesus, what came down had to go back up.

In our second focus text from Acts 1, we read an important message from the two angels to the bewildered disciples: "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." The angels basically corroborated the assurance Jesus gave to His disciples that He would return to take them to be with Him someday when everything is ready. Sadly, there are some folks who do not believe in the existence of a literal heaven and hell. There are some who believe that if heaven exists, everyone is going to go to heaven anyway because God is too kind and loving to send anyone to hell if it truly exists. The first part about God loving everyone is correct, but the second part is not correct because God is not going to send anyone to hell. What we personally decide when it comes to our faith ultimately will determine where we end up in eternity.

What we believe matters and one of the underlying reasons we celebrate Ascension Day is to remind us of the unchanging truth of Scripture – that Jesus Christ has returned to heaven for a season and when the set time comes, He will return to make things right permanently. While we await His return, we are to proclaim the Good News in word and deed that Jesus is not just one of the ways to get to heaven but the ONLY WAY. His resurrection gives us this assurance. This Jesus will come back to earth just as He returned and as we look forward to His return, I encourage us to be like Stephen and the many great cloud of witnesses through the history of the Church and proclaim the mystery of our faith with confidence: "CHRIST HAS DIED; CHRIST IS RISEN; CHRIST WILL COME AGAIN." "Come, Lord Jesus."

Jesus Taken Up Into Heaven

1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with ^[a] water, but in a few days you will be baptized with ^[b] the Holy Spirit."

⁶Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"
