

Membership of the Global Methodist Church (GMC) - 2nd Year Anniversary Celebration: As previously announced, we are fast approaching the end of our second year as a member congregation of the GMC. This is an important milestone for our congregation and a great opportunity to thank the good Lord for how far He has brought us against all odds. We are going to celebrate together on Sunday, June 29, 2025, and we are going to have a Guest Preacher on that day. More details on this celebration service will be provided in due course by the Planning Committee. Preaching Plan During Eastertide – Trinity Sunday: As previously shared, next Sunday June 8, 2025, will be Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate the birthday of the Church. The Season of Eastertide which is the 50 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday covers the 40 Days after the resurrection of Jesus when He made many appearances to His disciples until His ascension to the Father – Ascension Day was celebrated on Thursday May 29, 2025. We continue to explore some of the Scripture passages found in the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) which provides a three-year cycle of scriptural passages for use on Sundays and other major days of the Christian Year. The Lectionary follows the pattern of the Christian Year with each cycle beginning with Advent (the four Sundays before Christmas when we prepare for the coming of Christ) and ends with the last Sunday after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time or Kingdomtide (this period may include as few as 23 or as many as 28 Sundays). This Season begins with Trinity Sunday, June 15, 2025 (the first Sunday after Pentecost) and continues through the day before the first Sunday of Advent - Sundays of this Season are designated as Sundays after Pentecost. The following is a summary of the remaining weekly Messages up to Trinity Sunday (June 15, 2025):

- June 1, 2025 (Ascension Sunday) Lift Off (Acts 1:1-11 & Luke 24:44-53)
- June 8, 2025 (Pentecost Sunday) Promise Fulfilled (Acts 2:1-21 & John 20:21-23)
- June 15, 2025 (Trinity Sunday) Life in The Trinity Our Biblical Model (Romans 5:1-5 & John 16:12-15)

Jesus Taken Up Into Heaven

1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with¹⁶ water, but in a few days you will be baptized with¹⁶ the Holy Spirit."
