Update On Current Situation With Our Community of Faith - Special Invitation to Attend Administrative Council Meeting: We would like to extend an invitation to all members who are able to join us for our Administrative Council Meeting planned for this Tuesday June 10, 2025 at 2pm in the Parlor to get an update on the current situation regarding the future of our community of faith. As was discussed at the last Quarterly Congregation Meeting held on Sunday April 27, 2025 your leadership is exploring next steps regarding the preferred future that God has for our community of faith. In this regard, a joint meeting was held on Wednesday June 4, 2025 with the leadership of our sister Church, Mt. Zion GMC with our Presiding Elder, Rev. John Alice presiding. One of the potential options presented and discussed at the meeting was the possibility of a "Vital Merger" with Mt. Zion GMC - this option would have major implications for our community of faith which we would like to share with everyone as part of the discernment process. There is another option to remain as a separate congregation of the GMC. Based on our finances and projections, it has become clear that we can no longer afford to sustain our current facility with its many deferred maintenance needs and we are going to start exploring what our options are in this regard, including the sale of this facility and identifying another suitable location where we would move to either with Mt. Zion GMC if the Vital Merger is discerned as our best option or as a separate community of faith. In addition, based on our current finances and projections, the Administrative Council has made it clear to our Presiding Elder that we can no longer afford to have a Full Time Elder as our appointed Pastor and this means that a pastoral change will be happening here at Sixth Avenue in due course. While we understand that this all may be overwhelming for our members, we want to assure you that no final decision has been made on all these. We invite everyone to be in earnest prayer for the leadership of both churches as we discern together next steps under the guidance and leadership of the Holy Spirit. Please see Paul Jassogne, Chairperson of the Admin. Council or any member of leadership with any questions or plan to attend the meeting on Tuesday June 10, 2025 to get more details. Thanks!

Membership of the Global Methodist Church (GMC) - 2^{nd} Year Anniversary Celebration: As previously announced, we are fast approaching the end of our second year as a member congregation of the GMC. This is an important milestone for our congregation and a great opportunity to thank the good Lord for how far He has brought us against all odds. We are going to celebrate together on Sunday, June 29, 2025, and we are going to have a Guest Preacher on that day. More details on this celebration service will be provided in due course by the Planning Committee. Preaching Plan During Eastertide – Trinity Sunday: As previously shared, today June 8, 2025, is Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate the birthday of the Church. Today marks the end of the Season of Eastertide which is the 50 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday. We continue to explore some of the Scripture passages found in the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) which provides a three-year cycle of scriptural passages for use on Sundays and other major days of the Christian Year. The Lectionary follows the pattern of the Christian Year with each cycle beginning with Advent (the four Sundays before Christmas when we prepare for the coming of Christ) and ends with the last Sunday after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time or Kingdomtide (this period may include as few as 23 or as many as 28 Sundays). This Season begins with Trinity Sunday, June 15, 2025 which we will celebrate next week. The following is a summary of the remaining Messages:

- June 8, 2025 (Pentecost Sunday) Promise Fulfilled (Acts 2:1-21 & John 20:21-23)
- June 15, 2025 (Trinity Sunday) Life in The Trinity Our Biblical Model (Romans 5:1-5 & John 16:12-15)
