Happy Anniversary Sunday (June 29, 2025): As previously communicated, this Sunday has been set aside to celebrate our second year anniversary since disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church effective June 30, 2023. We officially became a GMC congregation effective July 1, 2023. This is an important milestone for our congregation and we will celebrate together after today's worship service with a light lunch. We want to extend a very warm welcome to our Guest Preacher, Rev. Greg Stover who is the Dean of the Allegheny West Annual Conference of the GMC.

Update On Current Situation With Our Community of Faith – Update: We would like to encourage members to continue their prayers for the current situation regarding the future of our community of faith. One of the immediate action step that was discussed at the Administrative Council Meeting held on Tuesday June 10, 2025, is to send a letter to all members and friends of Sixth Avenue GMC to ask them to consider making a commitment to giving over and above their current financial gifts to make up the current monthly shortfall between our income and expenses while we continue to take the crucial steps to discern the preferred future God has for us. The letter was mailed to all members last week and copies are available at the Information Desk in the Narthex. Let us keep praying for the next scheduled joint meeting of the leadership of both Mt. Zion GMC and Sixth Avenue GMC on Wednesday July 9, 2025. In the interim if you have any questions, please see Paul Jassogne, Chairperson of the Admin. Council, Dr. Gregg Witham (Lay Leader) or Pastor 'Debo or any other member of leadership. The Trustees are working with our HVAC Company to resolve the situation with the faulty air-conditioning in the sanctuary. Thanks!

Annual Conference of Allegheny West: The Allegheny West Provisional Annual Conference held its 2025 Annual Conference with the theme, "Start Planting" at the Mt. Vernon Nazarene University, Mt. Vernon, OH from June 18 – 21. At the gathering, a Special Offering was collected in support of Clergy Education and Training in our Conference. Also, representatives from the Kenya Annual Conference led by their Conference Superintendent, Rev. Wilton Odongo and Rev. Dr. Gabi Kopas, the Conference Superintendent of the Slovakia Conference of the GMC were in attendance. The Memorandum of Understanding and Agreement on the international partnership between our Conference and Kenya Annual Conference was signed by our Conference Superintendent, Bishop Jeff Greenway and Rev. Wilton Odongo. The gathering was also informed by the Chair of the Kenya Missional Partnership, Presiding Elder, Rev. Dave Carter that over \$41,000 was raised in support of the Bible For Kenya initiative – thanks for your support for this initiative. Another highpoint of the gathering was the ordination of 31 Deacons and 11 Elders. The gathering also elected the Delegates that will represent our Annual Conference at the General Conference coming up in Johannesburg, South Africa from August 30 – September 5, 2026. Fifteen Clergy and Lay Delegates were elected with Three Alternates and Three Reserve Delegates. We are happy to report that Pastor 'Debo was again elected as one of the Clergy Delegates that will represent our Annual Conference at the Global gathering. More details will be provided once available.

Summer Message Series: Our Summer Message Series, "By Faith" based on **Hebrews Chapter 11** will start on Sunday July 6, 2026. This Message Series will help us have a deeper understanding of the biblical definition of faith and why it matters in the lives of those who are followers of Jesus Christ. We will explore the stories of some of the biblical personalities listed in what scholars have described as the Bible Fall of Faith including Abel and Cain, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph and Moses and lessons of faith from their lives. Please be in prayer for this Summer Message Series to help move us to become those who walk more by faith than by sight. Our first sermon in the Message Series will be entitled "What Is Faith & Why Is It Important?" based on **Hebrews 1:1,6** and **Matthew 7:24-29**.

¹⁵ The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶ For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷ He is
