#### WEEKLY SCRIPTURE READINGS (August 31, 2025 – September 6, 2025):

(Scripture passages are from the New International Version (NIV) Bible unless otherwise indicated)

#### Sunday August 31 (Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost)

Scripture Reading: Genesis 37:1-11; Reflection Verses: Genesis 37:3-4

"Now Israel loved Joseph more than any of his other sons, because he had been born to him in his old age; and he made an ornate robe for him. When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than any of them, they hated him and could not speak a kind word to him."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: What useful lessons can we learn from Jacob's preferential treatment of Joseph?

#### Monday September 1 (Labor Day)

Scripture Reading: Genesis 37:12-36; Reflection Verse: Genesis 37:36

"Meanwhile, the Midianites sold Joseph in Egypt to Potiphar, one of Pharaoh's officials, the captain of the guard."

Reflection Question/Action for the Day: Why did Joseph's brothers decide to sell him into slavery? Why were they angry with the dreams that Joseph had and shared with them? Do you think Joseph should have been more discrete? Why or why not?

#### Tuesday September 2

Scripture Reading: Genesis 39:1-23; Reflection Verses: Genesis 39:9-10

"No one is greater in this house than I am. My master has withheld nothing from me except you, because you are his wife. How then could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?" And though she spoke to Joseph day after day, he refused to go to bed with her or even be with her."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: What can we learn from Joseph's refusal to compromise his integrity?

#### Wednesday September 3

Scripture Reading: Genesis 40:1-23; Reflection Verse: Genesis 27:22

"We both had dreams," they answered, "but there is no one to interpret them." Then Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell me your dreams."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: How can we be like Joseph by giving glory to God for our unique gifts?

#### Thursday September 4

Scripture Reading: Genesis 41:1-21; Reflection Verse: Genesis 41:16

"I cannot do it," Joseph replied to Pharaoh, "but God will give Pharaoh the answer he desires."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: Where in our life do we need to ascribe glory to God? What will be the benefit?

#### Friday September 5

Scripture Reading: Genesis 41:22-40; Reflection Verses: Genesis 41:37-38

"The plan seemed good to Pharaoh and to all his officials. So Pharaoh asked them, "Can we find anyone like this man, one in whom is the spirit of God?"

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: Where do you need to learn patience and develop trust in God as you wait on Him?

#### Saturday September 6

Scripture Reading: Genesis 45:1-28; Reflection Verse: Genesis 45:28

"And Israel said, "I'm convinced! My son Joseph is still alive. I will go and see him before I die."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: Where are you looking to God to give you a breakthrough? Can you pay the price?

## **Genesis 50:15-26**

### Joseph Reassures His Brothers

<sup>15</sup> When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us and pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?" <sup>16</sup> So they sent word to Joseph, saying, "Your father left these instructions before he died: <sup>17</sup> 'This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.' Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father." When their message came to him, Joseph wept.

<sup>18</sup> His brothers then came and threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said.

<sup>19</sup> But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? <sup>20</sup> You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. <sup>21</sup> So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them.

## The Death of Joseph

<sup>22</sup> Joseph stayed in Egypt, along with all his father's family. He lived a hundred and ten years <sup>23</sup> and saw the third generation of Ephraim's children. Also the children of Makir son of Manasseh were placed at birth on Joseph's knees.<sup>[a]</sup>

<sup>24</sup>Then Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die. But God will surely come to your aid and take you up out of this land to the land he promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob." <sup>25</sup> And Joseph made the Israelites swear an oath and said, "God will surely come to your aid, and then you must carry my bones up from this place."

<sup>26</sup> So Joseph died at the age of a hundred and ten. And after they embalmed him, he was placed in a coffin in Egypt.
