Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: What assignment has the Lord given to you? (see Matthew 28:18-20 for insight)

Thursday September 11

Scripture Reading: Exodus 6:1-12; Reflection Verse: Exodus 6:12

"But Moses said to the Lord, "If the Israelites will not listen to me, why would Pharaoh listen to me, since I speak with faltering lips?"

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: Where do you have doubts about your abilities? Will you trust God to use you like He did Moses despite his excuses?

Friday September 12

Scripture Reading: Exodus 12:31-51; Reflection Verses: Exodus 12:50-51

"All the Israelites did just what the Lord had commanded Moses and Aaron. And on that very day the Lord brought the Israelites out of Egypt by their divisions."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: What promises are you trusting the Lord to fulfil in your life? Do you have doubts?

Saturday September 13

Scripture Reading: Exodus 13:1-22; Reflection Verse: Exodus 13:22

"Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people."

Reflection Questions/Action for the Day: What has God given to guide you on your spiritual journey? (see Psalm 119:105)

Exodus 13:17-22

Crossing the Sea

¹⁷ When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them on the road through the Philistine country, though that was shorter. For God said, "If they face war, they might change their minds and return to Egypt." ¹⁸ So God led the people around by the desert road toward the Red Sea.^[a] The Israelites went up out of Egypt ready for battle.

¹⁹ Moses took the bones of Joseph with him because Joseph had made the Israelites swear an oath. He had said, "God will surely come to your aid, and then you must carry my bones up with you from this place." [b]

²⁰ After leaving Sukkoth they camped at Etham on the edge of the desert. ²¹ By day the LORD went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night. ²² Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people.

²³ By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw he was no ordinary child, and they were not afraid of the king's edict.

²⁴ By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. ²⁵ He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of

Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward. ²⁷ By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible. ²⁸ By faith he kept the Passover and the application of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel.

²⁹ By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as on dry land; but when the Egyptians tried to do so, they were drowned.
